Last Week's Program:

Program Chair, Phyllis Tellor had Josh Astarita introduce her guest speaker, Mike Mira. He is the Rotary District Committee Chairperson for the Disaster Preparedness & Response Committee. He talked to us about the Shelter Boxes and showed a very interesting video on the Rotary's shelter box commitments. When the tsunami disaster hit the Philippines this past year, one and one half million people were left homeless. An email was sent to all Rotary clubs in our district (6950). A request was made specifically for the purchase of Shelter Boxes for \$1000 each. Within 10 days the district received checks in amount of \$47,000 for 47 boxes. At the heart of every shelter box is a disaster relief tent for an extended family of 10. It is designed to withstand extreme temperatures, high winds and heavy rainfall. Internally the tent has private partitions that allow the recipients to divide the space as they see fit. In addition to the tent, there is a range of other survival equipment including thermal blankets and insulated ground sheets, essential in areas where temperatures plummet at nightfall.

Where malaria is prevalent, mosquito nets are supplied as well as life saving means of water purification. Water supplies often become contaminated after a major disaster, as infrastructure and sanitation systems are destroyed. This presents a secondary but no less dangerous threat to survivors than the initial disaster itself. The water purification equipment can provide a typical family up to 3 years worth of clean and safe water. A basic tool kit containing a hammer, ax, a saw, a trenching shovel, a hoe-head, pliers and wire-cutters enabling the survivors to improve their immediate environment by chopping firewood or digging a latrine, for example, where it is possible, to start repairing or rebuilding the home they were forced to leave. Key items are either a wood-burning or multi-fuel stove. The multi-fuel stove can burn anything from diesel to old paint. This provides the heart of the new home where water is boiled, food is cooked, and families congregate. In addition, there are pans, utensils, bowls, mugs and water storage containers. To date, 5000 shelter boxes have been sent from Rotary Clubs to the Philippines. That means \$5,000,000 from Rotarians all over the world. Our club purchased 4 boxes (\$4,000).
