

St. Petersburg College, AS dental hygiene students went on April 2nd to Pinellas Park Elementary and served 16 students. They placed 53 sealants and gave oral hygiene instructions. Two students had too much decay and could not receive any sealants. Overall, there was a lot of decay present on primary (baby) molars, so it was great they had the opportunity to place sealants on the newly erupted permanent (adult) molars prior to decay. The students are scheduled to visit the school three more times before the end of the school year.

Seal Out Decay: Pilot

Amy Krueger also wanted to help the local community through a pit and fissure sealant program but lacked the means to get the program underway. Now Amy is involved in a sealant program through SPC and the Pinellas County School Board. This sealant program got started through the generous help of the Pinellas Park Rotary, thanks to Christine Patel, member of the Rotary and full time faculty in the BAS Dental Hygiene Program. The criteria set forth by the Rotary Club were that funding would be provided up to \$5000 and that the pilot program would be implemented in a Pinellas Park school by April of 2013. Documentation was submitted and approved by SPC administration and the Pinellas County School Board and Pinellas Park Elementary School was chosen based on the number of free lunches provided and conversations with the school principal. The rotary funds paid for a chair, sealant supplies, a sealant light and other necessary materials to initiate the pilot program. During the pilot program, Amy and Katie Woods, full-time Dental Hygiene Faculty, screened, educated, applied pit and fissure sealants and fluoride to 25 5th grade children at Pinellas Park Elementary School who returned signed parental consents. Amy's future plans include involving the SPC dental hygiene students in the program and expanding into more grades at the school. This year the Rotary Club will fund the purchase of the sealant materials. In addition Amy won a grant through the SPC Innovations Grant Program to help support the expansion of the sealant program.

According to Rotary officials the support from Derby Lane has helped keep the West and Central FL S4TL Program solvent. The week-long S4TL Rotary leadership program is held every June at Florida Southern College in Lakeland FL. Approximately 150 high school Juniors are chosen from nearly every school from Crystal River to Marco Island. The chosen students are immersed in leadership training that will prepare them for their senior year and beyond graduation. Rotary's main objective is SERVICE-in the community, in the workplace, and around the globe. The 1.2 million Rotarians that make up more than 34,000 Rotary clubs in nearly every country in the world shares a dedication to the ideal of Service Above Self.
