
Last Week's Program:

Our meeting was graciously hosted by *Girl's Incorporated* at their facility located at 7700 61st Street in Pinellas Park. Program Director Kristina Fortner provided a brief film outlining what the program does for girls and a tour of the facility. There are currently 75 participants, with the year round average being around 125, with up to 200 during the summer. We were shown the Computer Room, which has 20 desktop computers as well as several laptops; the Library; the Stem Lab, a laboratory for science and engineering projects; the Study Area and the Dance and Art studios. The facility is open to participants from 2 pm through 6 pm, Monday through Friday. The study area remains open an extra hour for tutoring approved students until 7pm. Participants range in age from 4 year olds (who must already be in Kindergarten) through High School. They are charged membership fees on a sliding scale ranging from \$2 to \$75 per month. The Pinellas Park Program is one of 84 facilities located throughout the US and Canada, and



has strict rules against all forms of bullying, and teaches important life skills designed to improve self-esteem and encourage self-worth. Girl's In-
