This Week's Program: Program Chairman **Doug Oppenheimer** will introduce his son, **Christopher Oppenheimer**. Christopher is employed by Safety Harbor company Intrega Business Systems as a software expert. Intrega sponsors and conducts a free computer coding program for local 8 to 16 year old students. Coding, which Chris will explain, is the computer language that make

computers work, like developing websites, apps, programs, and games. Students participate in segmented programs where they learn specific computer skills and earn achievement belts and prizes. The after-school classes are held at the Safety Harbor Library and continue through the school year, with personal mentoring by company employees and older students. Approximately 250 have participated so far, gaining experience into the high paying computer and tech industries."

Due to the studying environment I experienced in my country, I am used to study hard, which help me perform well in my school right now. I have a 4.0 in both high school and college GPA thanks to the two Dual Enrollment classes I took last semester. Beside from that, I also participated in a volunteer program at my school, the teen court program, which is designed to help 9th and 10th graders. Every day after school I go to a Taekwondo club with my cousins to strengthen my body and mind. I do not have any job right now because I don't have a driver license Most of the time I am not at school, I help my family look after my cousins and take care of my dog. I plan on going to SPC after I graduate in May as I have already submitted my application to SPC last week. I also plan on transferring to USF College of Pharmacy after getting my AA degree because I want to become a Pharmacist in the future. "

"Hello my name is Austin Kirk, the son of Jeff and Annette Kirk, and I'm a senior at Pinellas Park H.S. in the Criminal Justice Academy. My GPA is within the top ten percent of students.
